Contact MLEC before you do any digging, pushing pipe, trenching or plowing. Your safety depends on it.

Avoiding Accidents

n addition to keeping your lights and broadband on and saving money, keeping trees and power lines well away from each other can save lives. When they touch, it can cause the tree to catch on fire, and it can also create a fatal electrical shock for children climbing on or playing around the tree.

With so much at risk, Meriwether Lewis Electric Cooperative works hard to prevent these situations through a proactive vegetation management program.

Understandably, tree trimming and cutting as well as herbicide spraying, are sensitive issues. However, with so much at risk, it is easy to understand why vegetation management is so important. MLEC uses a variety of approved, environmentally sound methods. Our trimming practices are in accordance with the International Society of Arboriculture and the National Arbor Day Foundation recommended guidelines and standards for good tree health. Likewise, sprays utilized by MLEC contractors are registered with the Environmental Protection Agency and administered by licensed applicators.
