





FCC Announced End to Affordable Connectivity Program

(March 18, 2024) — The Federal Communications Commission announced on January 11, 2024 the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) program ends in April 2024.

ACP participants receive a monthly credit for ACP. When the ACP available funding ends, accounts will have the ACP credit removed. The amount invoiced will increase by the amount of the ACP credit currently applied to accounts. Service will remain at the existing service level at the full undiscounted price when the ACP credit is no longer available, based on ACP application and contracts.
